

A singular noun indicates one person, place or thing. A plural noun indicates more than one person, place or things. Most of the singular nouns can be changed into plural forms by adding 's', but there are exceptions.

If a singular noun ends with 'y' drop the 'y' and add 'ies' Example- Baby- babies

If it ends with ch, sh, s, x or z, then add -es. Examples- Bus-buses, Tax-taxes

If the noun ends with f or fe, then drop the f and add -ves.

Example- Wolf- wolves
